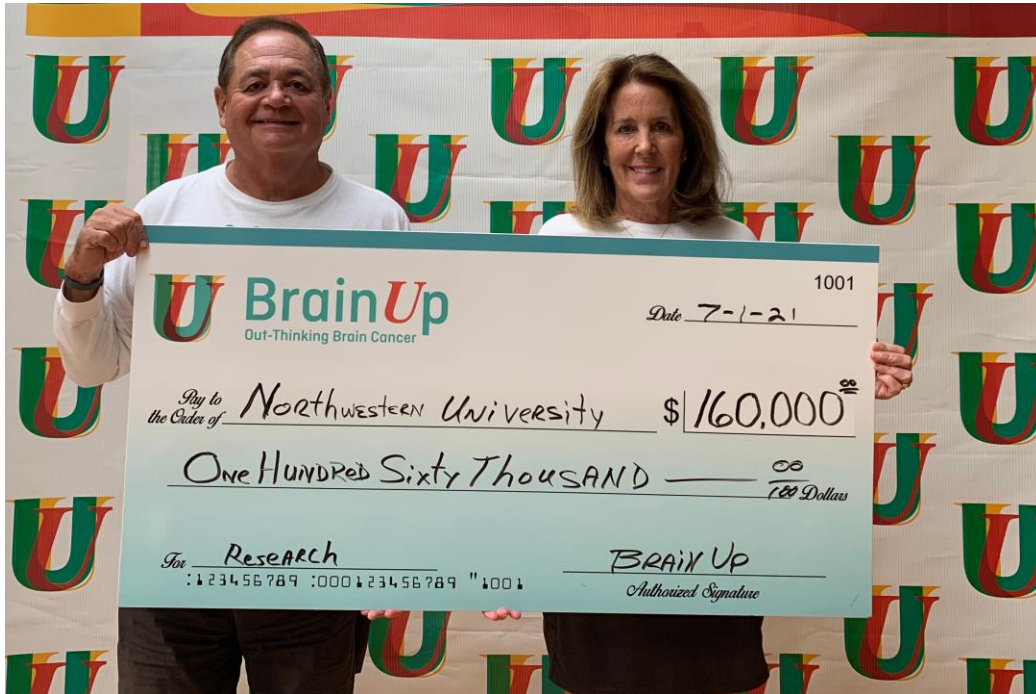


2020 BrainUp Awards a total of \$320,000.00 to 2 Chicagoland Hospitals

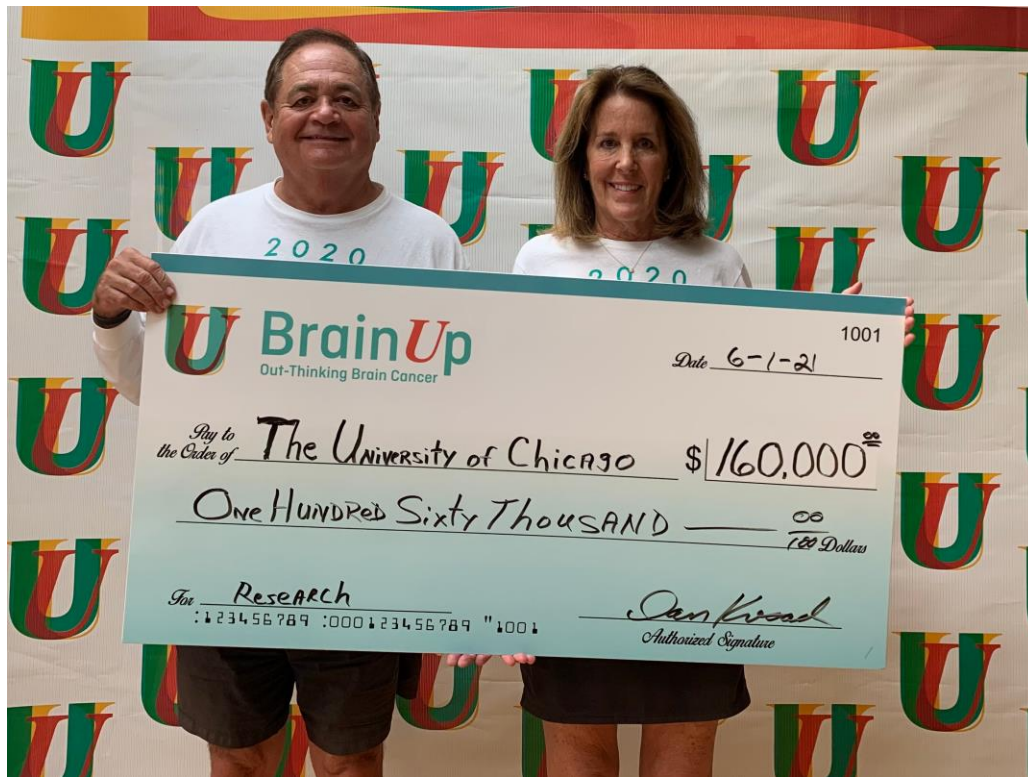
2020 Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine Department of Neuro-Oncology Receives \$160,000.00 From BrainUp

BrainUp is proud to share the news that from money raised at the 2019 and 2020 Annual Fundraising Run/Walk's allowed to present a donation of \$160,000.00 for the clinical trial research being conducted by Rimas Lucas MD Associate Chief of Neuro-Oncology Division At Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine. The trial is titled Combination of Checkpoint Inhibition and IDO1 together with Standard Radiotherapy in newly Diagnosed Glioblastoma's. This is a Phase 1 clinical trial. This trial integrates with the NCI BrainTumor SPORE P50CA221747 which provides funding for preclinical investigation related to the trial. Dr. Rimas Lucas is a physician dedicated to his work as a practicing physician with his patients with GBM as well as being a pioneer in research. BrainUp has a Medical Advisory Board comprised of Physicians that are Neuro-Oncologists and Researchers throughout the country to review all trials prior to funding is determined.

Research Continues with \$160,000.00 funding from BrainUp

BrainUp is proud to continue to fund the clinical trial in the amount of \$160,000.00 at the University of Chicago being conducted by Bakhtiar Yamini MD, Professor of Surgery. Director Neurosurgical Oncology The University of Chicago Medicine. The trial is titled, Repurposing Acetazolamide for chemosensitization in GBM. BrainUp granted this trial \$175,000.00 originally in 2018 as a multi-institutional trial, and with the success of the original research a request was made by University of Chicago to continue this research to enlist more patients. BrainUp is proud to support this multi-institutional trial as it has allowed all of the hospitals we partner with to be a part of this invaluable research. The request to continue this research was reviewed by the BrainUp Medical Advisory Board of Directors comprised of physicians that are Neuro-Oncologists and Researchers throughout the country.

These Check presentation unfortunately were not able to be done in person this year due to Covid restrictions, but BrainUp is proud to continue to support our Chicagoland hospitals that continue the much needed support to find new treatments for brain cancer.
